23% of Black patients reported poor communication with their physicians



Black patients are **1.5x more likely** to be uninsured than white patients.



1/4 of Black women delay or refuse treatment due to cost.



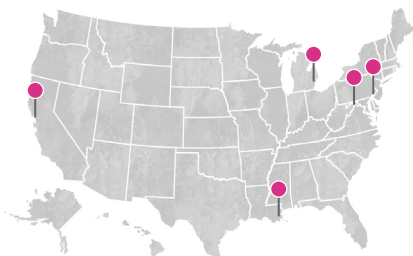
In D.C., the breast cancer death rate for Black women is **nearly three times** that of white women.



In D.C., only **32%** of Black women receive annual breast cancer screenings*.



40% of Black breast cancer patients have a diagnosis delay of two months or more.



Across the US, Black women are **40%** more likely to die from breast cancer than white women.
